

MI5 is the UK's national security intelligence agency

MI5 is responsible for countering <u>threats to national security</u>, including terrorism, espionage, cyber threats and the proliferation of weapons of mass destruction. To read more, see <u>what we do</u>.

MI5 is led by <u>Director General</u> Andrew Parker. We employ around 4,000 staff who are <u>organised into nine branches</u>, each with specific areas of responsibility.

Location

MI5's headquarters are at <u>Thames House</u> in London. We also have eight regional offices and a headquarters in Northern Ireland.

History

MI5 has played a vital and secret role in countering the activities of spies and terrorists for over a century. Since the late 1990s we have been releasing historical files to the <u>National Archives</u>. These files provide an insight into the work of MI5 and a behind-the-scenes look at famous spy cases from the 20th century.
